Dr. McCray Named Interim LH Superintendent

Dr. Nelson McCray has been named as interim superintendent by the Licking Heights school board. Dr. McCray (Nelson) is a graduate of Licking Heights, class of 1966, as well as a member and generous supporter of the Alumni.

Nelson is currently the Superintendent of the Licking County Educational Services Center. He will serve due to the resignation of Dr. Thomas Tucker, who is moving on to the Worthington school district and until a replacement is hired.

Nelson has been at the Licking County ESC for 14 years and has significant experience as superintendent. He served as superintendent of Beaver Local for seven years, Genoa Local for three years, and Monroeville Local for four years.

This appointment will allow the Board of Education time to search for and screen candidates for the best possible person. Board President Matt Satterwhite said having an official superintendent in place ensures that administrative duties can be carried out without any ambiguity.

This is not Dr. McCray's first time to step up and help the Licking Heights School District. Three years ago before Dr. Tucker was hired, Nelson was named interim superintendent. Our valued and talented alumni are always there to assist the District in many different ways. That's why we are all so proud of our alum, Dr. Nelson McCray.

Licking Heights Receives \$750,000 Early College Grant

The Licking Heights Local School District has been awarded a \$750,000 grant from the Ohio Department of Education to start an Early College High School. The district is one of six in the state to earn the grant out of 122 applicants. The ECHS will be a part of Licking Heights High School and will provide high school students the free opportunity to earn up to two years of college credit and an associate's degree, in addition to their high school diploma, by the time they graduate.

An ECHS will amplify the district's K-12 focus on college and career readiness and prepare graduates to enter traditional colleges with junior class standing or enter the world of work with an associate's degree in hand.

A press conference with the Governor's office, State Board of Education, and ODE leaders to officially award the grant was held in the lobby at the Ohio Department of Education on Wednesday, June 29.
